B.A. (Hons.) Political Science is an undergraduate three-year (six semesters) full time programme with an intake of 60 students. M.A. POLITICAL SCIENCE AND INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS

M.A. in Political Science and International Relations is two-year (four semesters) full time programme with an intake of 30 students in every academic year. The programme is divided into four semesters crafting specifically by putting the disciplinary knowledge more condensed and deeper as compared to the graduation level. This PG programme aims at building up the rich, diverse yet profound understanding of political phenomena, ideas, institutions and also increasingly complex relations which encompass patterns of interaction between states and transnational actors, and issues and factors shaping the present day's international order.

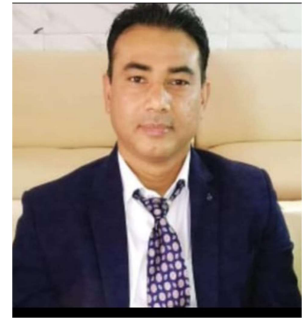
