

Possessing unfair means material and/or copying therefrom. ii. Transcribing any unauthorized material or any other use thereof. iii. Intimidating or using obscene language or threatening or use of violence against invigilator or leaving the examination hall without permission of the invigilator/ authority or causing disturbances in any manner in the examination proceedings. iv. Unauthorised communicating with other examinees or anyone else inside or outside the examination hall. v. Mutual/Mass copying. vi. Smuggling-out or smuggling-in of answer books, either blank or written, as copying material. vii. Smuggling-in blank or written answer book and forging signature of the university authority thereon. viii. Interfering with or counterfeiting of University seal, or answer books or office stationary used in the examinations. ix. Insertion of currency notes in the answer books or attempting to bribe any of the persons connected with conduct of examinations. x. Impersonation at the University examination. xi. Any other similar act/s and/or omission/s which may be considered as unfair means by the competent authority. <p style="text-align: center;">COMPOSITION OF COMMITTEE AND ITS PROCEDURE</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Composition of Unfair means Committee: On recommendation of Chairperson-Examination, The Competent Authority shall annually appoint Unfair Means Committee to deal with the cases of alleged use of unfair means and / or misconduct in relation to an examination. 2. The Centre Superintendent/Coordinator shall report to the Chairperson/ University Coordinator Examination all the cases of unfair means in the examination by giving details of the evidence and explanation of the candidate concerned on specified proforma. Provided further that in exceptional circumstances, the case can also be reported by Centre Superintendent/Coordinator/Members of the flying Squad directly on a plain paper. 3. In case the candidate refuses to make a statement explaining his / her conduct, his / her refusal shall be recorded by the Superintendent/Coordinator, which should be attested by the Invigilators on duty, present at the time of refusal. 4. While reporting a case of use of unfair means in the University Examinations detected by or in the presence of the member of flying squad/ invigilator on University duty, both the member of flying squad/ invigilator and the Centre Superintendent shall be required to sign the incriminating papers recovered from the possession of the candidate and those papers should also be got signed by the candidate. 5. On receipt of report from the Chairperson/University Coordinator, Examination, the UFM Committee may if they think fit, call upon the candidate alleged to have employed unfair means to appear before the Committee and to represent his/her case personally 	<p style="text-align: center;">Approved as Proposed</p>

or produce any evidence and/or witness before the Committee. He / she may be allowed to do so by the Committee at his own expense on the date and venue fixed for his appearance before the said Committee. In spite of doing the same, if the candidate fails to do so, he / she will be proceeded against ex-parte.

6. If during University Examination, a candidate is found having in his / her possession or accessible to him / her papers, books, notes or other material, which do not relate to the subject of the examination of the day and which could not possibly be of any assistance to him / her, no action shall be taken against him / her.

7. The Vice Chancellor shall have the power to decide the cases of ambiguity in the provisions of this regulation. The powers to be exercise by the Vice Chancellor shall be in conformity with the Act, Statutes and Ordinances of Gautama Buddha University.

Note:

- Due to cancellation of exam of a particular course/courses/semester may lead to year back if a student in such situations does not meet the promotion criteria as per GBU norms.
- In addition to above mentioned category of offences, the UFM committee is further empowered to apply its full wisdom in deciding the cases on the facts and circumstances.

Notes /explanations

(a) **“Unfair means relating to examination”** means and includes directly or indirectly committing or attempting to commit or threatening to commit any act or coercion, undue influence or fraud or malpractice with a view to obtaining wrongful gain to him/her or to any other person or causing wrongful loss to other person/s.

(b) **“Unfair means material”** means and includes any material whatsoever, related to the subject/course of the examination, printed, typed, handwritten or otherwise on the person or on clothes, of body of the candidate (examinee) or on wood or other material, in any manner or in the form of chart, diagram, map or drawing or electronic aid etc. which is not directly or indirectly allowed in the examination hall.

(c) **“Possession of unfair means material by a candidate”** means having any unauthorised material on his/her person or desk or chair or table or at any place within his/her reach, in the examination center and its environs or premises at any time from the commencement of the examination till its conclusion.

(d) **“Candidate found in possession”** means a student, reported in writing, as having been found in possession of unfair means material by the Invigilator, Member of the Vigilance Squad or any other person authorised for this purpose in this behalf, even if the unfair means material is not produced as evidence, because of it being reported as swallowed or destroyed or snatched away or otherwise taken away or spoiled by the student/candidate or by any other person acting on his behalf to such an extent that it has become illegible. A report to that effect shall be submitted by any authorized person to the Coordinator/ Controller of Examinations or any officer authorised in this behalf.

Fee Structure

The fee structure shall be decided or may be revised by the competent authority of the University from time to time. ***Academic Fee and Hostel Fees are same for the foreign nationals from SAARC and ASEAN nations and Indian nationals.***

In Addition to above fees:

i. Foreign Nationals of SAARC and ASEAN Countries: One time registration fee of US \$ 500 (or equivalent in Indian Currency as per the exchange rate) for Non-Technical or non-professional programmes of School of Buddhist Studies & Civilization, School of Humanities and Social Sciences, School of Vocational Studies & Applied Sciences, whereas **US \$ 1000** (or equivalent in Indian Currency as per the exchange rate) for technical and Professional programmes of School of Biotechnology, School of Engineering, School of Information Technology & Communication, School of Management and School of Law, Justice & Governance.

ii. International Students of other than SAARC and ASEAN Countries: One time registration fee of US \$ 700 (or equivalent in Indian Currency as per the exchange rate) for Non-Technical or non-professional programmes in School of Buddhist Studies & Civilization, School of Humanities and Social Science and School of Vocational Studies & Applied Sciences, whereas **US \$ 1500** (or equivalent in Indian Currency as per the exchange rate) for Integrated Dual Degree, Post Graduate, and Doctoral (Ph.D.) programmes of School of Biotechnology, School of Engineering, School of Information Technology & Communications, School of Management and School of Law, Justice & Governance.

iii. One time registration fee of US \$ 200 for Diploma/Certificate programmes from Foreign nationals of SAARC and ASEAN Countries and **US \$ 400** for Diploma/Certificate programmes from Foreign nationals of other than SAARC and ASEAN Countries.

In addition to the above fee:

- Hostel Charges per academic year: Rs. 35,000/- Per Annum
- Mess Charges on per academic year: Rs. 30,000/- Per Annum or as per actual

Whichever is higher?

Note:

1. Academic Fee will be charged semester-wise.
2. Registration fee of rupees ten thousand only is onetime fee and not a part of academic fee. It will be compulsory for all programmes/ courses. This is not refundable.
3. Caution Money of rupees ten thousand will be charged for all courses/ programmes. This is refundable after submission of no dues certificate from all departments through school dean.
4. Relaxation to SC/ST candidates in the fee is as per UP govt. norms/rules.
5. Hostel exemption would not ordinarily be allowed. Only in exceptional circumstances can it be allowed on case to case basis by the competent authority.





6. Fee would be liable to change from time to time.
7. The fee for the new programmes at S. No. 30, 31 & 32 may be as per terms and conditions of MOU with the agency providing training & teaching support.
8. The corporate sponsored candidates shall be eligible for admission on supernumerary seats all fees would be double except mess charges on such seats.
9. Fee includes library fund, computer fund, sports fee, student activities fund, reading material/books, knowledge generation fund, and laboratory fee.
10. Presently late fee is rupees 500/- per day after last date. In the case of late fee exceed to amount dues than the late fee should be deposited as equivalent to dues amount upto 31.12.2018. Sometimes, it shows that due to remaining amount of fee is lower than calculated late fee. Now late fee will be reduced up to rupees 100/- per day or maximum rupees 3000/- per Semester w.e.f. 01-01-2019.


